CLUSTER BOMBS 1: -- 0630 -- Today Blair is in Basra to  
congratulate our troops on the role they played in  
"liberating" Iraq. But in gaining control of Iraq,  
coalition forces used cluster bombs. During the war, Geoff  
Hoon said they were safer than "other unguided weapons to  
deal with, for example, vehicles spread over a  
battlefield". But what about in a built up area? There is  
growing evidence from Iraq and concern among Labour  
backbenchers that cluster bombs were used in built up areas  
and not enough is being done to find the unexploded
